In accordance with our Agreement, IntelliWaste, Inc. (IntelliWaste) is pleased to present our survey of current and future feedstock and recycled content usage within the Central Coast Recycling Market Development Zone (CCRMDZ) for Santa Cruz County.

The purpose and goal of this survey was to:

- 1) To identify and survey manufacturers that currently use recycled materials to manufacture new products within the CCRMDZ as to their ability to increase their use of recovered materials.
- 2) To identify manufacturers not currently using recycled materials to manufacture new products within the CCRMDZ as to their ability to use recovered materials.

While the term "manufactured" is used throughout this survey report, we have also included building and construction companies as part of the group of companies we contacted. These non-manufacturing industries can and do use recycled feedstock post-consumer materials as part of their industry practice.

To accomplish these purposes and goals, IntelliWaste performed the following tasks:



TASK 1:

<u>Identify manufacturers from publicly available databases using available sources specifically for Santa Cruz County</u>. We developed a list of the industries most likely to have recycled product feedstock requirements.

TASK 2:

Contacted the candidate manufacturers and conducted a telephone interview to discuss the company's raw material usage and feedstock requirements. Interviews were conducted predominately over the phone, as we have learned that this is the most effective way for reaching companies. In the event that a company's phone number was not made publicly available, we used emailed as an alternative means for communication. During each interview, we asked basic questions from each company regarding the type of business they are engaged in. These interviews were supplemented by internet research used to develop a work paper profile for each company. Using this information, each company profile consists: the company name; interviewee name; telephone number; website, if applicable; number of company employees; recycled content type and usage; equivalent raw material source and usage; future plans to substitute and incorporate local recycled materials into their manufacturing process; and other pertinent information.

TASK 3:

<u>Identified current material generator flow pathways of recycled feedstock within Santa Cruz County to determine where materials are moving from and to.</u>

TASK 4:

<u>Identified recycling/reuse/options in Santa Cruz County for recycled feedstock materials.</u> We will discuss the present recycling/reuse conditions within Santa Cruz County and present findings.

RECYCLED FEEDSTOCK MATERIALS

Feedstock is defined as raw material required for an industrial process. Recycled feedstock is further defined as material that has been previously recycled that can again be used as basic feedstock or reused in a primary manufacturing process. While the definition is applied to manufacturing processing, we have further expanded the term to include agricultural industries that use organic products such as compost. The following recycled feedstock materials are known to be used in various manufacturing and agricultural processes.

Metals such as copper, aluminum and steel



- Plastics
- Construction and Demolition Materials (C&D) such as concrete, aggregate and rock
- Glass
- Wood and organic materials such as compost
- Tires

In the case of recycled feedstock as a raw material, the likely target customer is an industrial manufacturer who would be willing to test, reformulate, and retool (if necessary), to use the recycled feedstock. Depending on the process and the end product, either a percentage of recycled feedstock can be used in a formulation, or when technically feasible, 100% recycled-content feedstock is used. The recycled-content feedstock must have some measurable benefit; e.g., more efficient production, better product performance or aesthetics, more flexible delivery, or lower cost.

LIST OF SURVEY QUESTIONS

For each company contacted, IntelliWaste prepared a specific list of questions to inquire about recycled feedstock usage (post-consumer) either current or for potential use in the future. Depending on the initial response from the manufacturer, some or all of the questions were posed as part of the interview process. Some interviewees wished not to have their name published for a variety of reasons in order to participate in the survey. Given the nature of their response and in keeping with the spirit and goals that the CCRMDZ maintains in conducting this survey, future follow-up can be made at the address and phone number referenced. The interview questions included:

FEEDSTOCK SURVEY QUESTIONS

- 1. What type of feedstock material(s) do you use?
- 2. What are some of the advantages of using recycled vs. raw or virgin material?
- 3. What are the disadvantages?
- 4. What was one of the primary reasons your company decided to engage in using recycled material?
- 5. Were government subsidies or tax benefits a decision in using recycled materials?



- 6. How much recycled feedstock material comes from Santa Cruz County?
- 7. Do you produce waste from your recycled material?
- 8. Where does most of your recycled material come from?
 - Curbside
 - Manufactured recycled material
 - Processed
- 9. Do you recycle the waste?
- 10. Do you plan to expand or abandon the use of recycled feedstock material within the next 5 years?

During the interview process, we provided information regarding CCRMDZ programs and encouraged manufacturers to explore future usage of recycled feedstock and post-consumer materials into their product specifications.

All excess glass is recycled postproduction.

The company logs wood through their own land as well as land they lease through contracts with other companies. The wood they log is milled and sold as boards. Naturally, the company has no use for recycled wood, as they are in the business of working with raw wood. However, the company does recycle all of its wood scraps.

Billet Metal Craft is a machine shop that has been operating for six years and currently has three employees. The company manufactures car parts, sporting goods, and hardware for construction purposes. They utilize 3D CAD software and CNC machines for all of its manufacturing needs. The materials they utilize include aluminum, steel, stainless steel, and plastics. The owner, Asher Rios, stated that they mainly use raw materials, though he stated that he is unsure if they use any recycled materials in their manufacturing process. These materials are sourced from various suppliers within California.

The owner stated that they would not be able to switch to using recycled feedstock, as this may compromise the structural integrity of their products. Furthermore, their choice of materials is dictated by the customer's instructions, so they do not have significant influence in choosing the materials they work with. The company does, however, recycle all of the aluminum scraps and some of the steel scraps. All plastic scraps are currently sent to the landfill.

The owner, Alan Blaine, estimates that approximately 10% of the steel he uses is recycled and is obtained locally. The company saves any scraps and sells them. The owner stated that he is interested in learning more about recycled feedstock options and ways he can save money by using more recycled materials.

Cabinet Town is a manufacturer and distributor of cabinetry for residential and commercial needs, and has been operating for 24 years with 4 employees. The company supports environmental sustainability and has designed its manufacturing process to have as little environmental impact as possible. They recycle all waste such as packaging materials, stone waste, and sawdust, as well as purchase wood from companies that practice sustainable forestry. They use a stone countertop fabrication process consisting of 100% recycled water, optimize materials in a way that leaves little room for waste, and offer green countertop surface materials.



According to the company's owner, Kit, Cabinet Town uses plywood and hardwood which are sourced mainly from within Santa Cruz County from a local supplier. The company chooses recycled feedstock materials when possible because of their commitment to sustainability, though recycled feedstock only comprises about 10% of their total feedstock usage. The reason for this low percentage is due to the fact that it is significantly more expensive to use recycled or reclaimed wood for cabinetry. In general, the type of wood required for cabinetry work is not available recycled. Given this, the company's owner does not feel they can expand their use of recycled feedstock at this time.

In an effort to support green building, the company prices their LEED-certified products similarly to standard products. Ultimately, however, the company receives their specs from architects which indicate raw or recycled materials. The company contact stated that because they have to comply with what the architects they work with want, the company has no way of expanding its use of recycled feedstock.

When speaking with the company contact, Sarah Renson, we learned that all of the materials used to manufacture their mechanical parts are raw because the certifications required by their customers do not allow for recycled materials to be used. These materials are sourced from within California. The company contact stated they there is no possible way the company could consider using recycled feedstock in the future.

The company was established in 2009 and currently employs 2 people. The company prides itself in using recycled feedstock to manufacture its products, using recycled ABS plastic that comes from e-waste, as well as recycled steel. The e-waste is sourced from MBA Polymers, an electronic waste supplier that used to have facilities in Richmond, CA (this local facility has recently closed). The steel used for the base of their lamps is also recycled; with 70% made of scrap metal. This steel is also sourced locally from a supplier in Richmond. The only raw materials used are LED light bulbs and electronic parts; even the cardboard packaging is made of post-consumer content, though this is sourced from Minnesota. According to the company contact, Nancy Wahl-Scheurich, each lamp is comprised of 58.4% post-consumer content when completed.



The company also produces little waste during the manufacturing process; any material that is expended during the injection molding process is reused. This is an excellent example of a company striving to maximize its use of recycled feedstock. The company contact stated that she would like to learn more about ways her company can expand its recycled feedstock use further and potentially benefit from government subsidies and tax breaks.

This is due to the fact that many customers often come in asking for recycled materials. However, the company does not manufacture anything, but rather installs marble and granite residentially and commercially. The company is therefore not relevant to this study.

Michael Wood Metalsmith has been in business for 4 years and is run by a single employee. The company owner and only employee, Michael Wood, classified the business as an artisan blacksmithing company that creates products for architectural and decorative needs. According to the owner, the main material used is recycled steel. The reason for using recycled steel rather than raw steel is because it is what the supplier provides him, in addition to the fact that it is a cheaper and more sustainable option. He stated that approximately 90% of the steel he works with is recycled. Occasionally, he uses raw steel when he is manufacturing a product that needs to be stronger structurally. Any waste that is created during the manufacturing process is recycled. The owner stated that while he is very busy, he would like to learn about expanding his use of recycled feedstock and ways he can benefit from tax benefits and government subsidies.

Raw materials are used more frequently because of the structure and drying process; recycled wood typically dries naturally and therefore can have structural issues, as well as has hidden nails that compromise the wood. The owner expressed that it is difficult to use recycled wood for these reasons, though the company has researched it. This type of feedstock is used approximately 5% of the time, but the company uses certified wood when possible. The company also recycles its leftover wood scraps, turning them into firewood or wooden toys.

The company creates bags and accessories made from recycled bicycle tubes and tires as well as car upholstery scraps. These materials are sourced from local bike and upholstery shops, which hold these materials until they are picked up by the company's owner, Lauren Junker. She estimates that she receives approximately 10 pounds of bike tubes per week. The only raw materials she uses in her production process are zippers, Velcro, and thread. She attempted to used recycled versions of these materials, but found that the process of extracting these materials from recycled products like pants and bags was too painstaking of a process.

The company does produce a small amount of waste during the manufacturing process, which is then sent to a landfill. Other materials that she receives from her suppliers that are too difficult for her to work with are also sent to a landfill. Ms. Junker stated in our interview that the idea to work predominately with recycled materials came from a desire to turn trash into something functional. Totally Tubular Design's use of recycled bike tires, an otherwise wasted resource, is very much a selling point for the company; many of her customers purchase her products specifically because they are made of recycled materials.

Ms. Junker confirmed that she has heard of some government programs that provide support to companies using recycled materials through word-of-mouth only. She stated that she is very interested in learning about ways her company can qualify for government subsidies and tax benefits as a way to grow her business and expand its use of recycled feedstock.

IDENTIFY CURRENT MATERIAL GENERATOR FLOW PATHWAYS OF RECYCLED FEEDSTOCK WITHIN SANTA CRUZ COUNTY TO DETERMINE WHERE MATERIALS ARE MOVING FROM AND TO.

Based on the information gathered through this survey, the majority of recycled feedstock used by manufacturing companies in Santa Cruz County is principally generated outside the CCRMDZ area. Many companies source their materials from other areas of California, while others source their materials from other states or internationally.

IDENTIFY RECYCLING/REUSE OPTIONS IN SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FOR RECYCLED FEEDSTOCK MATERIALS.

This section discusses the present recycled feedstock conditions within Santa Cruz County as well as our findings based on our interviews with companies.



- Principal manufacturing companies in Santa Cruz County include cabinetry, surfboards, tiling, and woodworking. It appears as though there are many smaller sized companies present in the county, though that perception may be due to the fact that smaller companies tend to be easier to contact directly for purposes such as this study as opposed to larger manufacturers.
- The use of raw feedstock of any material type for manufacturing in Santa Cruz County is common due to a concern that using recycled feedstock would compromise the durability of the final product. Throughout the interviews, we identified a dominant perception that using all raw materials ensures the highest quality product. The same perception goes for their customers; often customers assume raw materials are the most durable, and therefore request those materials be used for their products. This then affects the manufacturers, many of whom manufacture their products based on what the customer requests.
- Many company contacts we spoke with disclosed that they are unaware of any potential recycled options for their industry and therefore continue to use raw materials out of convenience. Additionally, among the companies contacted, there is a commonly-held assumption that there are no recycled feedstock options available for their particular industry.
- Very few of the companies contacted were aware of government subsidies and tax benefits that are available to companies working to expand their use of recycled feedstock. This is also the case for companies that are currently using a high volume of recycled feedstock in their manufacturing process. This lack of knowledge about the available options to companies may indicate why so few companies consider exploring recycled feedstock as a viable option.
- Most of the companies' contacted attempt to recycle their waste post-production, even if they stated that sustainability was not a large factor in their business model.
- A portion of the manufacturing companies interviewed stated that they are not interested in pursuing sustainable business practices such as incorporating recycled feedstock into their manufacturing process.
